Learners First is delighted to welcome Stephen Howse (Lead Developer of the SMID Report and creator of the ASCL Data Toolkit) and Anthony McBride (Education Consultant at SMID) to lead this interactive workshop focussed on the use of data. During the workshop, we will consider how the new OFSTED framework might shape our approach to data. Steve will talk about best practice with data and the dangers of using data poorly. He will be identifying trends in this year's data, exploring the ideas of David Blow via interactive transition matrices and examining the implications for Progress 8 moving forward. There will also be an opportunity to explore the implications of ASP and IDSR. In addition, Anthony will explore how effective use data can enhance and inform teaching and learning. There will be an opportunity to discuss and share how data is used in our schools.

- ◆ **Stephen Howse:** is a former Head of Maths and Assistant Headteacher responsible for pupil progress and is the creator of the ASCL Data Toolkit. As a director and lead developer of the SMID Report, Steve believes that Attainment/Progress 8 represents a great opportunity to deliver consistency and inclusivity. His confidence that effective use of data can dramatically improve pupil outcomes comes with the caveat that it has to be presented to teachers in the right way; simple and accessible. Most recently, Steve has been exploring how schools can use data as a collaborative tool, encouraging professional learning.
- ◆ **Anthony McBride:** with 15 years of experience in secondary school education, Anthony's last role in school saw him with responsibility for behaviour and off-site provision. More recently, Anthony has worked as a consultant with hundreds of schools across the North of England with a particular focus on professional learning projects such as lesson study. Anthony views Attainment and Progress 8 as a fantastic opportunity for schools to use data as a collaborative CPD tool.
