Teacher CPD Seminars/Workshops: Autumn Term 2019

- ◆ **Art in the Primary Curriculum: 17th Oct & 11th Nov 2019**
This two-day workshop will be led by Kate Taylor, an experienced teacher and deputy head with a specialism in Art. The workshops are designed to support non-specialist teachers to develop a skills based approach to teaching art within the curriculum.
- ◆ **STEM in the Primary Curriculum: 21st Oct 2019**
This practical workshop will be led by the STEM senior leader and provide delegates with an opportunity to consider the teaching of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths within the primary curriculum.
- ◆ **Inclusion in the Primary Curriculum (1): 25th Nov 2019**
This workshop will provide delegates with a facilitated opportunity to explore how the curriculum has been designed to promote: inclusive and positive behaviour; British values; SEMH; and nurture (including references to the new Trailblazer pilot).

Teacher CPD Seminars/Workshops: Spring Term 2020

- ◆ **Humanities in the Primary Curriculum: 20th Jan 2020**
This workshop will provide delegates with an opportunity to consider the teaching of humanity subjects within the primary curriculum, including how schools can prepare for the Geography Gold Mark Award.
- ◆ **Inclusion in the Primary Curriculum (2): 10th February 2020**
This workshop will provide delegates with a facilitated opportunity to explore how the curriculum promotes inclusive practice with particular reference to: SEND; Pupil Premium; and disadvantaged.
- ◆ **Incorporating Social Change in the Primary Curriculum: 26th March 2020**
This workshop will focus on how social change studies have been incorporated into the curriculum to enhance learning experiences and develop pupils as leaders of change for the future. The workshop will include case studies of how pupils have led social change through the Nemesis project.
