Primary & Secondary CPD Opportunities

Professional development and networking opportunities for Early Career, Year 2, teachers.



Teachers are the foundation of the education system - there are no great schools without great teachers. Teachers deserve high quality support throughout their careers, particularly in those first years of teaching when the learning curve is steepest... However, too often, new teachers have not enjoyed the support they need to thrive, nor have they had adequate time to devote to their professional development.

(DfE, January 2019, Early Career Framework)

In January 2019 the DfE announced the launch of the 'Early Career Framework' (ECF) as part of its strategic endeavours to support teacher recruitment and retention in the state education sector. The ECF will 'underpin an entitlement to a fully-funded, two-year package of structured support for early career teachers linked to the best available research evidence alongside funded time off timetable in the second year of teaching and support for mentors'.

The Early Career professional development programme has been designed to reflect the challenges teachers in the early stages of their careers face within the classroom. It has been organised into core themes, building on the content and approach of the Early Career Framework. This is to provide a progressive professional development pathway with practical support, strategies and ideas to ensure that colleagues 'learn that' from a variety of 'learn how to' elements of the Early Career Framework.

The programme has been designed to be aligned with the Early Career Framework, using core training materials taken from the Education Development Trust (EDT) and aligned to the self-study materials available for NQT +1 colleagues. The programme will be delivered through a series of online webinars with elements designed by a range of specialist colleagues. Webinars are available for both PRIMARY and SECONDARY early career, NQT +1, teachers (previously named RQTs), or

colleagues interested in refreshing their knowledge or further developing their skills. Delegates are welcome to attend as many sessions as they wish to, within the programme. Bookings should be made by accessing the associated link in each section overleaf.









The Approach

The EPD sessions have been designed by a team of Head Teachers, Senior Leaders and subject specialists from a range of different schools, phases and contexts. As well as facilitated discussions and the sharing of current and emerging classroom practice, the sessions will also make reference to educational research, relevant wider reading and the Early Career Framework.

The EPD sessions offer colleagues in the early stages of their teaching careers fantastic professional development opportunities which are rooted in current and real classroom practice. They offer both professional challenge and support and are designed to help colleagues:

- Build upon their previous learning to further develop their own knowledge, skills and classroom competencies;
- Reflect upon and refine their teaching practice;
- Explore and understand the effectiveness and rationale for using different models, methods and approaches by juxtaposing their own School/MAT approaches with sector research and those which are used in other schools and settings; and
- Build professional networks with peers from other schools and settings at similar stages in their teaching careers.

Colleagues are able to engage with as many or as few of the EPD sessions as they feel are appropriate to their role, their professional development needs and/or their areas of interest. (There is no obligation to attend all sessions.)

Audience

The EPD sessions have been primarily designed for Early Career, Year 2, teachers (previously named RQTs). However, teachers who have been in the profession longer, those who are returning from a period of absence, have recently changed roles/phases and/or who wish to attend any of the sessions as a 'refresher' are more than welcome to do so.

Across the EPD offer, there are sessions which have been designed for phase specific audiences as well as a number of cross-phase opportunities.

The programme will be delivered through a series of online webinars.

This session is facilitated by the Learners First English Hub, who specialise in supporting the development of early reading and phonics. Colleagues will revisit the foundations of how understanding that to access the curriculum, early literacy provides fundamental knowledge and that reading comprises two elements; word reading and language comprehension and that systematic synthetic phonics is the most effective approach for teaching pupils to decode. Colleagues should have an understanding that every teacher can improve pupils' literacy by explicitly teaching reading, writing and oral skills
